Navigating Challenges and Embracing Growth

The past year has been particularly challenging but infinitely rewarding.

"The League" continues to take more animals on their hope to love journey with each year despite households suffering from significant increases in cost of living.

Our current issue is the reduction in our adoption numbers. It is getting tougher, with Councils offering dogs from pounds at \$50 to adopters.

At AWL NSW we importantly desex all our animals, provide thorough veterinary health checks, microchipping and behavioural realignment on their way to new loving homes.

If you buy an animal from a pound for \$50 the animal, it may only be microchipped.

While we charge a higher per dog, that is still cheaper in the long term as it excludes the long-term costs. It's a case of buyer beware and not many are aware of the costs they will be up for post ownership.

We have been particularly active in stakeholder relations. Many are aware of the funds we have received from the Office of Local Government.

With those funds we are going full tilt at creating an animal care innovation precinct at our abandoned West Hoxton site. We will repurpose that facility to provide an inspectorate command centre, a respite facility for animals that have been impacted by domestic violence and a facility for councils to deal with pound overcrowding. We are also starting fitouts in Bega, Orange and Glen Innes to develop our expanded Regional Animal Care Centres. This will be the single biggest transformation that AWL NSW has embarked on since we started.

Over the coming year we will also be undertaking a Kemps Creek site masterplan. This plan will enable enhanced, new, and bigger facilities so we can expand our operations and future-proof AWL NSW to provide more services for animals and people in need.

On a final note, I am delighted to announce some key staff promotions. Amanda Grey has been appointed as Chief Inspector of our new Inspectorate team that is performing very well. Sam March has also been appointed as the new head of Animal Welfare Services. Please join me in welcoming them to their new positions.

It is a particularly exciting time to be involved in animal welfare.

I would like to thank our wonderful Board, volunteers, members, staff and our generous donors for all their assistance and efforts over the last 12 months.
