Pet Legacy Program

Planning for the future of your pets is essential in securing their safety and wellbeing in the event that something happens to you. Our **Pet Legacy Program** is an option for those who have thoughtfully included a bequest to AWL NSW in their Will. It ensures that your pets will have a safe place to go and someone to care for them should you no longer be around.

How the Pet Legacy Program works:

- 1. Contact our Bequest team to receive appropriate paperwork and information by emailing bequest@awlnsw.com.au.
- 2. Bequeath your animals and a gift to Animal Welfare League NSW in your Will.

- 3. Should you pass away, your animals will come into our care.
- 4. After initial veterinary checks, we will place your pets in a permanent foster home. They will remain under the guardian and ownership of AWL NSW. All ongoing requirements for their care such as medications and nutrition will be covered by us.
